

SUMMER SCHOOL PROCEDURES

(Revised November 2009)

Recipients of the Governor Guinn Millennium Scholarship may enroll in and receive the scholarship for summer term as long as they meet all continuation and degree-seeking requirements.

To receive funding for summer, students must have either

- ✓ Received the Millennium Scholarship at an eligible institution the spring prior, or
- ✓ Are already enrolled in the minimum number of credits required for the institution for the following fall term.
- ✓ Students *must* be enrolled in a program of study leading to a recognized associate degree, baccalaureate degree or pre-baccalaureate certificate, even if it is a different institution.
- ✓ Students may be funded from .5 up to 12 credits (this exception to the minimum number of credits applies to summer enrollment only).

Students must pre-pay for summer courses and are reimbursed the same per-credit amount as for fall and spring terms (up to 12 credits system wide) for courses passed with a grade of “D minus” or better, regardless of item or overall GPA. There are no minimum enrollment requirements for summer funding. Further, students cannot lose eligibility based upon summer term work. Students are reimbursed after the end of the fall add/drop period.

The following procedures have been established for disbursing summer school funds:

- ✓ Students are reimbursed for summer courses they have successfully completed with a passing grade, provided they:
 - ◆ Were enrolled in a degree or certificate program at an eligible institution in the prior spring or in the current fall term;
 - ◆ Are enrolled in a degree program at an eligible institution if different from the institution attended in either the fall or spring term; and
 - ◆ Maintained eligibility in the spring term.

Eligible students who activate their Millennium Scholarship for the first time in the summer term (including newly eligible Millennium Scholars who recently graduated from high school) must:

- ✓ Meet the requirements for initial eligibility; and
- ✓ Be enrolled in a degree or certificate program at an eligible institution in the upcoming fall term.

By approximately October 1, after the fall disbursement to students, campuses begin reimbursing students for summer courses and transmitting end-of-term information to the Millennium Scholarship Program in the State Treasurer’s Office.

FAQs

Can a student receive Millennium Scholarship funds for summer school courses?

Yes, upon satisfactory completion of the course the student will be reimbursed \$40 per credit for NSHE community college lower division courses and \$60 per credit for upper division courses, \$60 per credit for state college courses and \$80 per credit for courses at other eligible institutions.

Is a student required to take a minimum number of summer credits in order to be reimbursed?

No, the minimum credit criteria are waived for the summer term.

Will summer school courses count towards fall eligibility for continuing students?

Fall eligibility is based upon the spring semester completion of credits, GPA, and satisfactory progress towards a degree. The GPA for summer school coursework will be included in the cumulative GPA at the end of the fall term and may affect eligibility for spring funds for students who graduated from high school on or before May 1, 2003, regardless of whether or not Millennium Scholarship funds were used to pay for the summer courses.

Do I have to be in a degree program for summer school even if I have declared a major at another institution?

Yes, you must be making satisfactory progress toward a degree, even if the degree is different from the eligible institution you attended in the previous spring semester or will be attending in the following fall semester.
